16-18 *Mint* Study Programme

Mint is a free course for young people aged 16-18 (16-24 with an EHCP) who may be unsure of the next steps in their career and would benefit from having access to a variety of opportunities in different occupational areas of interest in order to make an informed choice about their future. At the same time students will work towards a recognised employability qualification, GCSE English and maths / Functional Skills (if necessary) and a high quality work experience placement. Within 6 months, students will be able to progress onto a traineeship, apprenticeship, into employment or further education.



Study Programmes (Headstart 16-18)

Training is available across all of our delivery sites. Headstart programmes are generally made up from three core elements that include;

- Vocational skills and qualifications
- Work Experience Placements
- Functional Skills (Maths, English and ICT)

Headstart is a great free training programme to help you get the right skills, qualifications and experience to get you where you want to be.

In addition to the above Nova's Headstart programme can also help you with the following;

- Training to prepare you for college or to get an apprenticeship or a job
- Help with employability skills such as, CV writing and interview skills
- Confidence building and team work skills
- Work experience placements

Headstart is for anyone who has left school and is aged 16-18 or those aged 19-24 who have learning difficulties and/or disabilities. The programme is predominantly at level 1 but can include level 2 skills and qualifications. Nova's Headstart course is able to offer training in the following vocational areas;

- Motor Vehicle
- Plumbing
- Bricklaying
- Painting and Decorating
- Carpentry
- Plastering
- Hair and Beauty
- Hospitality
- Business Administration
- Customer Service
- Retail

Nova offers a full range of progression routes for the above and in most circumstances are able to offer Level 2 & 3 Apprenticeships.



16-18 Advance Course

If you're aged 16-18, the Advance course is designed to help you move forward and prepare for your future career. By the end of the course you'll be more confident and more employable!

What does the course involve?

- Work experience with a local employer
- Vocational tasters, so you can learn about what you do and don't enjoy
- Qualifications, including maths and English:
- Improving your employability and work skills
- Teamwork, confidence building and meeting new people

You will have your own keyworker who will support and guide you.

The course content will be based on the goals you want to achieve

- You will also receive help with travel costs
- Depending on your household income, you may be eligible for 16 - 19 bursary payments

What are the progression opportunities?

The Advance Team will help you move on to a traineeship, apprenticeship, employment or college.

Students work towards gaining a Level 2 award in Personal Development and Employability here at Kickstart. The award itself is governed by The Prince's Trust and is made up of different units of work for the students to focus on.

The students focus has been on completing their Managing Money and Digital Skills, this looks at debt, Budgeting, understanding deductions, banking and understating interest, while the other unit consists of e-safety and using common digital skills and how they can be useful in the work place. The Students will be moving onto the Career Planning unit shortly where we will have help from Future Focus and the DWP.

The aim is for students to complete their level and leave school with these skills behind them as they progress into their post 16 careers.
